The supply chain council states that the supply chain is a term used by logistics professionals which encompasses every effort involved in producing and delivering a final product from the suppliers' suppliers to the customers' customer. Four basic processes are: plan, source, make and deliver. This includes managing supply and demand, sourcing raw material and parts, manufacturing and assembly, warehousing and inventory tracking, order entry and order management, distribution across all channels and delivery to the customer.
